Additionally, each donated blanket comes with a motivational or comforting quotation or message, McLeod


It's the type of donation that McLeod knows first-hand can be appreciated by recipients.

"I just thought there has got to be other people that feel like this and just need some encouragement or words of wisdom," she said. "In that time of need when you're escaping out of a situation, to have something like that to hold on to is important. It was important to me.'

Blanket Statements offers customers a variety of blankets to purchase including fleeces, afghans and quilts. McLeod stressed that people can know that the blanket they donate is identical to the one they purchased for them-

"We're not donating cheaper blankets," she said.


County. She said she did a Web search for shelters one night and found the sites, and Joe Kvidera at Turning Point was the first to respond to her donation request.

drag on growth WASHINGTON - Sales of ne homes plummeted in January and businesses ordered fewer long-lasting goods. But the number of people applying for unemployment benefits has fallen over the past four wee to the lowest level in two-and a-half years.

Together, the government reports Thursday sketched a mixed picture. They suggest that the struggling housing industry remains a drag on a economy that's growing slov but steadily.

The reports showed:

- · New-home sales dropped 12.6 percent last month to a seasonally adjusted annual ra of 284,000, the Commerce Department said. That's less than half the pace economist consider healthy.
- Companies' orders for lon lasting manufactured goods, excluding the volatile aircraf and auto categories, dropped 3.6 percent last month.
- Applications for unemploy ment benefits dropped by 22,000 last week to a season ally adjusted 391,000, the La Department said. It was the third decline in four weeks.

House bill would end foreclosure plans

WASHINGTON - The House Financial Services Committee plans to write legislation next week ending the Obama administration's flagship effo for helping struggling homeowners avoid foreclosure at abolishing three other housing assistance programs.

At its meeting next Thursda the highest-profile target of Republican-run committee w be the Home Affordable Mod fication Program. The Treasu Department has acknowledg the program won't meet its original goal of preventing 3 million to 4 million foreclosu and last month a federal insp tor general said it has been a failure.

IRS eases liens rules

WASHINGTON - The Intern Revenue Service says it's try to help people who are strug gling to pay delinquent tax b so it's reducing the number of property liens and easing rul for small businesses to enter

into installment agreements The steps will double the amount of back taxes a pers can owe before facing a possible lien. Previously, taxpay who owed at least \$5,000 a ignored numerous IRS notice would get an automatic lien placed on their property. Und the new policy, the threshold increased to \$10,000.
